With the end of winter and warm weather upon us please remember the following rules and regulations established by the city to keep our city clean and to respect our neighbors and other residents:

- ◆ Do not park on the boulevards unless you have an established parking space of either asphalt or concrete.
- ◆ Do not park across the public sidewalks.
- ◆ Please be courteous with your music or other loud noise. Your neighbors may not want to listen to the same type of music, and they also have a right to enjoy their back yards. Per Ordinance #377 your music could be considered a nuisance and ticketed (no decibel meter standards required).
- ◆ Don't forget your burn permit before you burn. Check out <http://www.dnr.state.mi.us/burnpermits/> to see if burning is allowed in Dickinson County. If it is stop down city hall to get your permit to burn.
- ◆ If you enjoy having a campfire please keep your fire pit smoke under control. Again consider impacts to your neighbors when the wind is blowing.
- ◆ Per Ordinance #391, Dogs must be on a leash or in a fence. Please keep your dog on a leash especially when you walk them in the public like at Strawberry Lake, Hanbury Lake, or Marion Park. You may have a wonderful, friendly dog that loves everyone or any other dog. I may not and if your dog runs up to meet mine and my dog attacks yours (while on a leash), I would feel bad but not responsible since your dog is loose.
- ◆ Also per Ordinance #391, please pick up after your dog if it defecates on public property. This includes sidewalks, boulevards, parks or any other public places.
- ◆ Reminder, recycle bins are only for marked recycled items. NO HOUSEHOLD TRASH.
- ◆ ORV's and HUV's are welcome on city streets but not alleys, per Ordinance #386 Wear your helmet and anyone under the age of 16 must be directly accompanied by an adult.
- ◆ Don't forget to check to see if your project requires a zoning compliance permit before you start. You may need this even if you don't need a building permit.

Scrap Tire Grant

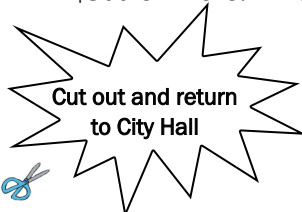
