NOTICE—Traffic Control Order

Traffic Control Order TC18-03 was approved October 15th by the Norway City Council. This traffic control order is to establish a bus loading and unloading zone on the South side of 4th Ave. adjacent to the school property. This bus parking zone will be from the first crosswalk on 4th Ave. from the East side of Section St., to the 3rd crosswalk on 4th Ave. Signs will be posted: ***NO stopping, standing or parking, bus loading and unloading zone, from 7:30am to 8:30am and 2:30pm to 3:30pm Monday through Friday.*** This will become effective immediately once signs are installed.

Non-Emergency Phone Calls

For after hour calls, and utility outages call city hall at 563-9961 and hit the proper department (*electric, water, sewer, etc*). A message is sent to the person in that department to take the call. If you have a police issue and need an officer immediately (*not utility/streets issue*) call dispatch at 774-6262 and they will dispatch accordingly. If you do not need an officer immediately and just want to leave them a message you can call 563-5801. An officer will return your call when they become available.

When you call City Hall after business hours, listen carefully to the message and respond appropriately.

UTILITY BILL PAYMENT Utility bills for the City of Norway can be paid at the Northern Interstate Bank of Norway, or at the branch located in Pat's Food's. We also have two drop boxes for payments (*no cash please!*) a walk up box located in front of City Hall and a drive-up box in the alley behind City Hall.
