## Non-Emergency Phone Calls

This past year the city had to change its after hour call procedures. The county would no longer accept utility outage calls through dispatch. We changed the procedure so that you now call city hall at 563-9961 and hit the proper department (*electric, water, sewer, etc*).

A message is sent to the person in that department to take the call.

The county dispatch still takes police calls. If you have a police issue and need an officer immediately (*not utility/streets issue*) then call dispatch at 774-6262 and they will dispatch accordingly. If you do not need an officer immediately and just want to leave them a message you can call 563-5801. An officer will return your call when they become available.

**When you call City Hall after business hours, listen carefully to the message and respond appropriately.**

## Leaf Pick-up



Every fall the city comes by and does a leaf pick-up from the boulevards. The City **DOES NOT** pick up brush. Please continue to take your brush to the compost site located near the golf course on Oak Crest Drive.

The City of Norway will be picking up leaves that are piled on the Boulevard. This will start October 29th and run approximately two weeks.



**Please DO NOT rake the leaves into the street. Per City ordinance #410, No person shall sweep or cause to be swept any dirt or litter of any kind or type whatsoever out of or off of any building or private property and into any public, sidewalk, parkway, alley or roadway of the city.**

With leaves dropping in October, you may need to take them to the compost site.

### Compost Site Hours

The Norway Area Compost Site will be closed during deer season, November 12th and re-open December 3rd.



*Also, even though the sign does have the posted hours, the site is and will remain open 24/7 until closing for the season.*
