BACK TO SCHOOL - BUS SAFETY REMINDERS

Bus loading and unloading zone on the South side of 4th Ave. adjacent to the school property. The bus parking zone is from the first crosswalk on 4th Ave. from the East side of Section St. to the 3rd crosswalk on 4th Ave. The bus loading zone was created to prevent congestion during the times that the school busses are picking up students. As the signs clearly indicate there is to be no parking or standing during the identified bus loading times which is 7:30am to 8:30am and 2:30pm to 3:30pm. Standing by definition includes stopping, which is currently happening when you stop to pick up your child. You are NOT allowed to enter the bus loading zone during the prescribed times even if your child is waiting on the curb for you. The rule was established due to the congestion, bus drivers must have clear and uninhibited access for both the safety of the children and the general public. Tickets will be issued if we cannot get compliance.



Please be courteous toward our bus drivers and the students loading and unloading for school.

School bus safety tips for drivers:

- Prepare to stop when a slowing bus has its overhead yellow lights flashing
- Stop at least 20 feet away for buses when red lights are flashing, unless driving in the opposite direction on a divided highway
- Slow down in or near school and residential areas
- Look for clues-such as safety patrols, crossing guards, bicycles, and playgrounds-that indicate children might be in the area
- Watch for children between parked cars and other objects

School buses are like traffic signals

- When overhead lights are flashing yellow: Prepare to stop
- When overhead lights are flashing red: Stop
- When hazard warning lights are flashing: Proceed with caution

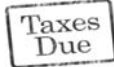

NORWAY AREA COMPOST SITE

The Norway Area compost site is now open and available for both

Norway City and Township residents **only!!!**

The site is currently open on a 24/7 basis for the benefit and convenience of our residents provided the following rules are followed:

- Follow Signs and deposit in designated areas
- Grass Clippings and Leaves (NO BAGS!!)
- Brush must be under 2 inch diameter (NO Stumps)
- Residents only

Unapproved uses include the following:

- No Contractors (residential only- *this includes contractors hired by residents to remove trees and brush*).
- No Construction Material or household trash
- No brush over 2 inches in diameter, stumps, full trees, trash, and bags.

Compost site will remain open as long as we do not have any issues with illegal dumping. If illegal dumping occurs, we will close down 24/7 access.

As a reminder, there is NO curb side pick-up.
